


Beyond Childcare:

The Power of Early Years Learning

20 years ago marked a significant shift from 'childcare' to greater emphasis on early years learning. It's easy to see the benefits of childcare to allow us to get to work on time, spend time volunteering or focussing on our studies. In fact, our own circumstances are the primary motivator for placing our children into a childcare setting yet, for children, early experiences are extremely important in their own right. Attending a nursery or play group lays the very foundation in which every child builds their confidence, curiosity and capacity to thrive in their future year.

The first five years of life are a time of astonishing growth. A child's brain is developing faster than it ever will again, forming connections that shape how they think, feel, and relate to others. Every story shared, every block stacked, every song sung together strengthens not only their knowledge, but their sense of belonging in the world and their place with others.



High-quality early learning through curiosity and play isn't about keeping children busy but about nurturing them. The brain needs repetition to learn, but it learns far more efficiently when it's engaged in joyful, meaningful play. Where rote learning may require hundreds (sometimes thousands) of repetitions to form neuropathways, play can build the same neural pathways in as little as 20 times because curiosity, connection, and emotion supercharge neuroplasticity. The entire Early Years Curriculum is about guiding children as they learn to express emotions, solve problems, and collaborate with others. It's about helping them to discover the joy of learning, so that curiosity becomes a lifelong companion.

Children who experience nurturing early education gain more than just a "head start." They learn how to communicate, to listen, to care and to persevere (what we often call Meta Skills) – the very ingredients for positive life experiences. They learn that their ideas matter and that learning is something exciting, not something to fear. These lessons don't fade with time but ripple forward into school, work, and family life.

For parents and communities, accessing early years learning is not just about childcare, but is a vital investment in the future. When we value early education as the powerful, purposeful foundation it is, we give our children the tools to shape their own stories with confidence and compassion.

The early years are not just the beginning of education — they are the beginning of everything.

EXPANDING ESOL OPPORTUNITIES


We are delighted to share that our ESOL tutor Jamie is now qualified to assess National 4 ESOL, marking a fantastic professional achievement.

This qualification will allow Rosemount to deliver National 4 ESOL classes in the near future, creating even more learning and progression opportunities for our learners.

SENSORY ROOM COMING SOON

We are delighted to announce that we have secured funding to create both a sensory room and a sensory space in our main nursery. This exciting project is made possible through the support of Spifox, a property and construction charity dedicated to improving the lives of children.

These new sensory environments will be completed within the next six months and will provide calm, engaging spaces that support learning, wellbeing, and development — creating a truly inclusive experience for every child.





Suicide prevention research

At Rosemount Lifelong Learning we participated in suicide prevention research, aiming to improve the access to compassionate support for anyone affected by suicide. This has been conducted through community-led action research.

The research was supported by Scottish Community Development Centre as part of a project funded by the Scottish Government contributing to the suicide prevention strategy 2022-2032, 'Creating Hope Together'. We are also in collaboration with Suicide Prevention Scotland and Penumbra Mental Health.

For this project, we focused on a specific community of identity: asylum seekers and refugees within the Glasgow area. Our research methods included both qualitative and quantitative surveys, but the main method was focus groups.

This community-led research, Creating Hope Together, explores the experiences of asylum seekers and refugees in Glasgow and highlights the inequalities contributing to suicide risk within this group.

Participants described how barriers to work, education and the asylum process strip people of dignity, create isolation, lead to hopelessness and the inability to work identified as the most harmful.

Despite these challenges, children, faith, and community remain powerful sources of hope and reasons to stay alive. This report calls for urgent action to address these structural inequalities - granting the right to work, improving access to education, culturally sensitive support and creating safe community spaces.

Aligned with the Scottish Governments Creating Hope Together Suicide Prevention strategy, which seeks to reduce suicide deaths in Scotland and tackle the inequalities that drive them, this research identifies the specific barriers and inequalities faced by asylum seekers and refugees that must be addressed now to restore dignity, inclusion and hope.

Alongside this, Rosemount, in partnership with Glasgow Kelvin College, has delivered First Aid, Food Safety & Hygiene, and Wellbeing & Fitness courses, and continues to deliver ESOL and Photography sessions.



Stephen's story

'Rosemount Lifelong Learning Centre has a special place in my heart. I feel very grateful to this project for what it has given me.'

I first started in late 2021 after doing a lot of shielding during Covid times, as my mum had been fighting cancer. I knew I needed to get back into doing something positive for myself, so I joined up for an IT Course covering Microsoft packages. June Phillips led the computer course and was very helpful/knowledgeable/supportive and helped me gain some confidence in IT.

During this time, I found out they were doing a community photography course, so I signed up for this too.

My initial curiosity for photography developed into a passion, with the help of Aleksandra (tutor), her enthusiasm/insight & creativity sparked something inside me, which grew and grew.

It was a 3 month rolling programme, which I kept on coming back for time after time. During this period my confidence was growing all the time, to the point I actually started an NQ and Course at City of Glasgow College in 2024 ended up passing the course with a 100% pass marks.



"I attend the Glasgow Kelvin college Introduction to Photography classes at Rosemount centre every Thursday. I live locally so I have no travel cost and the centre provides tea, coffee and snacks.

The sessions are really interesting and I am learning so much and the college provides all equipment and materials. The lecturer is very patient and friendly and explains everything clearly. I have also met some really friendly people in the class who share the same interests, tips and ideas."




